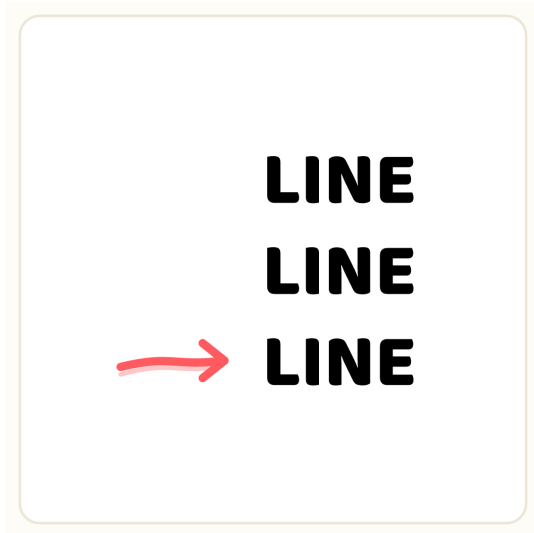

Answer Key

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1. Bottom line. The arrow points at the lowest of three LINES, the bottom line.
2. Rags to riches. RAGS followed by two RICHES reads as rags TWO riches, which sounds like rags to riches.
3. Golden handshake. The word HANDSHAKE printed in gold reads as a golden handshake, the executive send-off payment.
4. Paid under the table. PAID sits under TABLE, so it reads paid under the table.
5. Cog in the machine. COG appears inside the word MACHINE, giving cog in the machine.
6. Dress for success. DRESS followed by four copies of SUCCESS reads as dress FOUR success, which sounds like dress for success.
7. Fall in love. The word FALL sits inside the word LOVE, so you read fall IN love.
8. A match made in heaven. MATCH MADE sits inside HEAVEN, so you read a match made IN heaven.
9. Heart to heart. The word appears two times, and two sounds like TO, so it reads heart TO heart.
10. Remind (re + mind). The note RE plus MIND does what every calendar ping does: REMIND you.
11. Right as rain. The words AS RAIN lean to the right, so the slant supplies the missing first word: right as rain.
12. The calm before the storm. CALM stands just ahead of STORM, the calm before the storm.
13. Banana (Ba + Na + Na). Barium, sodium, sodium: Ba Na Na peels into BANANA.
14. A fork in the road. FORK is written inside the word ROAD, a fork in the road.
15. Level up. LEVEL is written reading upward, so it is a level going up, level up.
16. Down for the count. The phrase 4 THE COUNT reads downward and the 4 sounds like FOR, giving down for the count.
17. The ball is in your court. BALL is written in the middle of YOUR COURT, so the ball is in your court.
18. No sweat. The word SWEAT is crossed out, meaning there is no sweat.
19. Second to none. 2ND reads as SECOND and the lone 2 sounds like TO, giving second to none.
20. Top seed. The arrow points at the TOP of the three stacked SEEDs, the top seed.
21. To be or not to be. 2B ('two-bee'), R ('ar'), NOT, 2B read aloud give the Hamlet line TO BE OR NOT TO BE.
22. Accelerate. X ('ex'), L ('el'), R ('ar'), 8 ('eight') said together sound like ACCELERATE.
23. I owe you one. The letters I, O, U plus the number 1 read aloud say I OWE YOU ONE.
24. An ace up your sleeve. ACE sits up above SLEEVE: an ace up your sleeve.
25. Female (Fe + male). Iron is Fe on the periodic table: Fe plus MALE reads FEMALE.
26. Easy come, easy go. EZ ('ee-zee') reads as EASY twice, giving EASY COME EASY GO.

27. Open (O + pen). Oxygen is just O: O plus PEN swings OPEN.
28. In over your head. IN sits over YOUR HEAD: in over your head.
29. Cup (C + up). Carbon is C on the periodic table: C plus UP fills a CUP.
30. Four eyes. Four copies of the letter I read as four Is, which sounds like four eyes.
31. Cafe (Ca + Fe). Calcium is Ca and iron is Fe: together they brew a CAFE.
32. Torn between two lovers. TORN sits between two copies of LOVERS: torn between two lovers.
33. Light at the end of the tunnel. LIGHT appears at the very end of the word TUNNEL.
34. Small fry. FRY printed in tiny letters reads as SMALL FRY, an idiom for someone unimportant.
35. Big top. TOP printed in giant letters reads as BIG TOP, the main circus tent.
36. Fifth wheel. The arrow points at the FIFTH of five WHEELS, the odd one out: a fifth wheel.
37. Six figures. FIGURE appears six times, so the pay is in six figures.
38. Two thumbs up. THUMBS appears twice and both copies read upward: two thumbs up.
39. Repaid. DIAPER in reverse is REPAID: a debt every parent understands.
40. Reward. DRAWER read backwards is REWARD.
