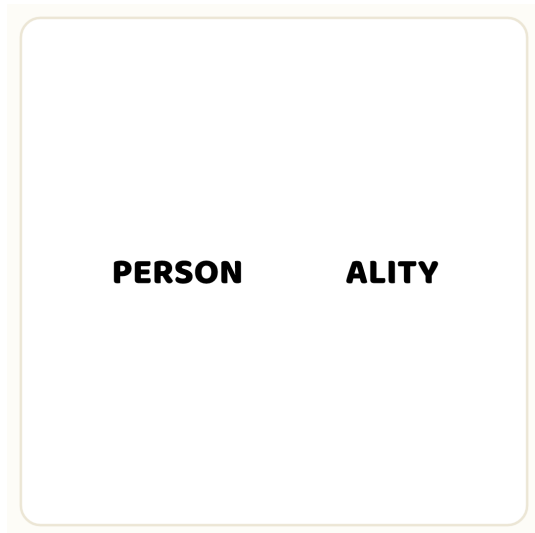

Answer Key

1. Split personality. The word PERSONALITY is split in two by a blank gap: split personality.
2. Bend over backwards. The phrase BEND OVER is printed backwards (mirrored): bend over backwards.
3. Cross my heart. A line crosses the words MY HEART: cross my heart.
4. Foresees. Four C's: 'four Cs' said aloud is 'foresees'.
5. Easy for you to say. E-Z sounds like 'easy', 4 = 'for', U = 'you', 2 = 'to', then SAY: 'easy for you to say'.
6. Before you know it. B-4 sounds like 'before', U = 'you', NO sounds like 'know', then IT: 'before you know it'.
7. Under one roof. The numeral 1 sits under ROOF: (all) under one roof.
8. Cut corners. Four CORNERS, each crossed out: the corners have been cut: cut corners.
9. The upper hand. Of two stacked HANDs, the upper one is circled: the upper hand.
10. Short end of the stick. The word STICK is written with its last letters tiny: its end is short: short end of the stick.
11. Too many irons in the fire. Four IRONS are crowded inside FIRE: too many irons in the fire.
12. Big fish in a small pond. A giant FISH sits inside a small, split POND: a big fish in a small pond.
13. Red herring. The word HERRING printed in red ink literally shows a red herring: a misleading clue.
14. Growing pains. The letters of PAINS grow larger left to right: the pains are growing: growing pains.
15. Second nature. The arrow points at the SECOND of three NATUREs: second nature.
16. Bottoms up. The word BOTTOMS is rotated so it reads upward: bottoms up.
17. No end in sight. The word END is crossed out while sitting inside the word SIGHT, so there is no END in SIGHT.
18. Too good to be true. 2 = 'too', GOOD, 2 = 'to', B = 'be', TRUE: 'too good to be true'.
19. Forgive and forget. 4GIVE sounds like 'forgive' and 4GET sounds like 'forget': forgive and forget.
20. Wait and see. W-8 sounds like 'wait', N is shorthand for 'and' (as in rock 'n' roll), C sounds like 'see'.
21. A cut above the rest. CUT sits above THE REST: a cut above the rest.
22. Deviate. D-V-8 said aloud: 'dee-vee-ate': sounds like 'deviate'.
23. Escapee. The letter names S-K-P: 'ess-kay-pee': sound like 'escapee'.
24. Tutu. Two 2s said together: 'two-two': sound like 'tutu', the ballet skirt.
25. Upper crust. The arrow points at the upper of two CRUSTs: upper crust.
26. Inside joke. JOKE is placed in SIDE: an IN-SIDE joke.

27. Comeback. COME is printed backwards: come back: a comeback.
28. Miles apart. The word MILES has been pulled apart by a wide gap: miles apart.
29. Second opinion. The arrow singles out copy number two of three OPINIONS, a second opinion.
30. Par for the course. PAR, the digit 4 read as FOR, then THE COURSE: par for the course.
31. Break even. The word EVEN is shown snapped in two, a break in EVEN reads as break even.
32. Growing apart. The letters of APART grow larger from left to right, so the word is growing apart.
33. Third wheel. The arrow singles out the third of three WHEELS, the third wheel.
34. Kickback. KICK is printed backwards, kick plus back makes kickback.
35. The elephant in the room. The word ELEPHANT is wedged inside the word ROOM, so it reads as the elephant in the room.
36. Head and shoulders above the rest. HEAD AND SHOULDERS is placed above THE REST, giving head and shoulders above the rest.
37. Get to the bottom of it. GET TO sits at the bottom of a large IT, so it reads get to the bottom of it.
38. Read the fine print. PRINT is set in tiny type, so it is fine print: read the fine print.
39. Actions speak louder than words. ACTIONS is printed huge and WORDS tiny, so actions are louder: actions speak louder than words.
40. The last straw. The arrow points at the final STRAW of four, giving the last straw.
